1. Chippewa County Safe Streets & Roads for All (SS4A) Safety Action Plan – R. Kuehl & F. Anderson

6. REPORTS

1. Chippewa-Eau Claire MPO Long Range Transportation Plan – E. Anderson

Anderson with the Chippewa-Eau Claire Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) presented handouts of their 2025 Long Range Transportation Plan and reviewed key information contained in the plan.

2. State Highway Projects – J. Leech

Leech provided an update on the upcoming State road construction schedule and noted that additional information will be available at the Commission's next meeting.

3. City of Chippewa Falls Street Projects – B. Cesafsky

Cesafsky advised the Commission of construction scheduled for this summer on Elm Street between Bay Street and Bridge Street. He added that the City will be coordinating with the State on the timing of the project.

4. Chippewa County Highway Projects – C. Elstran

Elstran reported that he did not have any updates on County construction at this time. He noted that at the next meeting he expects to have a better idea of the County's construction schedule.

5. Chippewa County Crash Statistics – A. Clark

Sgt. Clark provided a comparison of crash statistics from 2024 and 2025, noting increases in most categories. He also reviewed two fatal crashes that have occurred since the Commission's last meeting.

6. Wisconsin DOT Traffic Safety Updates – D. Kontos

Kontos provided a presentation from the Bureau of Transportation Safety (BOTS)

7. Roundtable report – All

Elstran introduced Chief Brian Tonnencour with the Chippewa Falls Fire & Emergency Services Department to the Commission and shared that he will be joining the Commission.

Lenbom spoke regarding the Public Health Department's work on car seat safety. Last year, the Department conducted 89 car seat inspections, and in 71 of those cases they were able to provide a new car seat through the county. A WisDOT grant will be used to purchase new car seats for families in need.

There were no future agenda items to consider at this time.

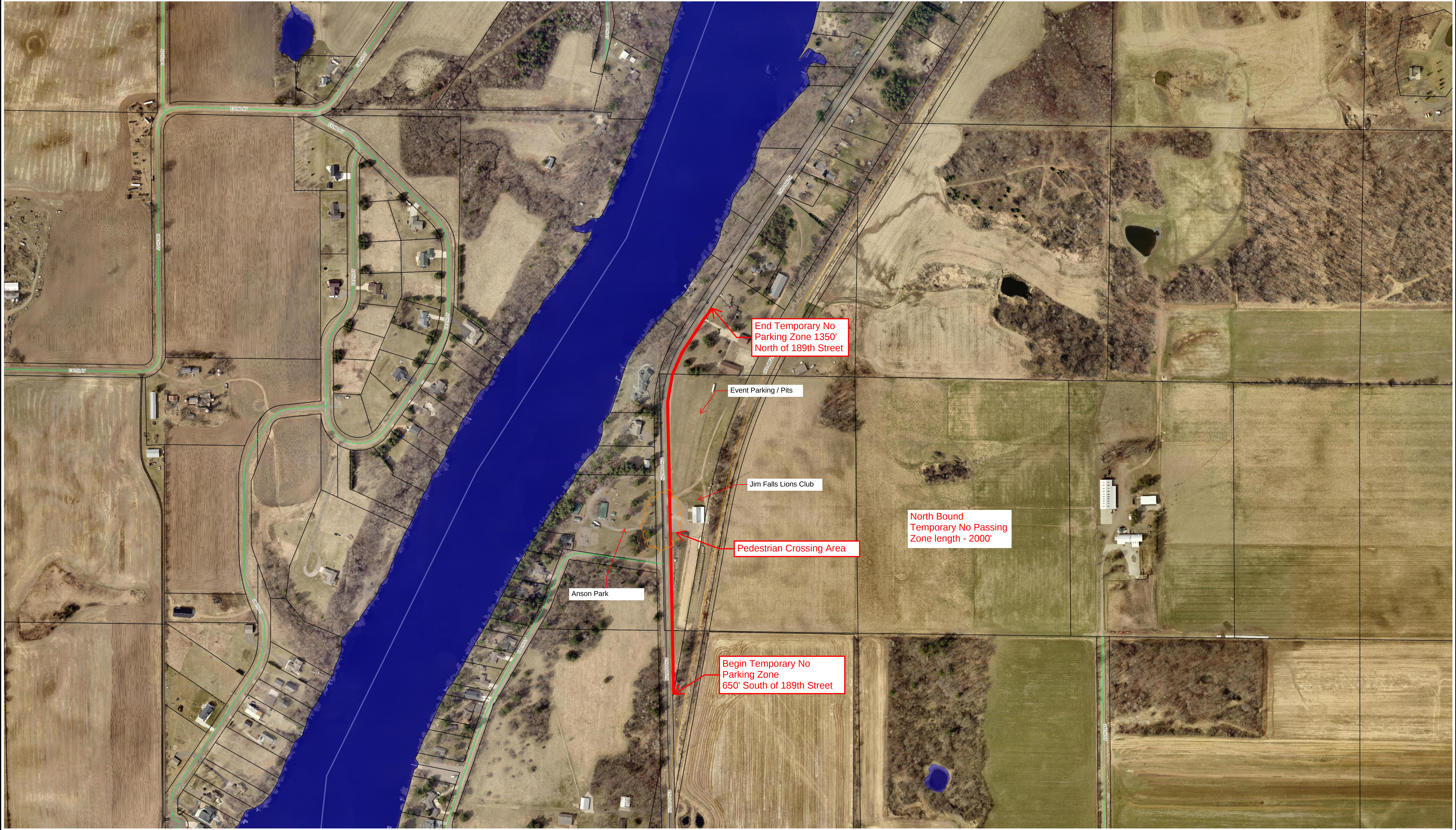

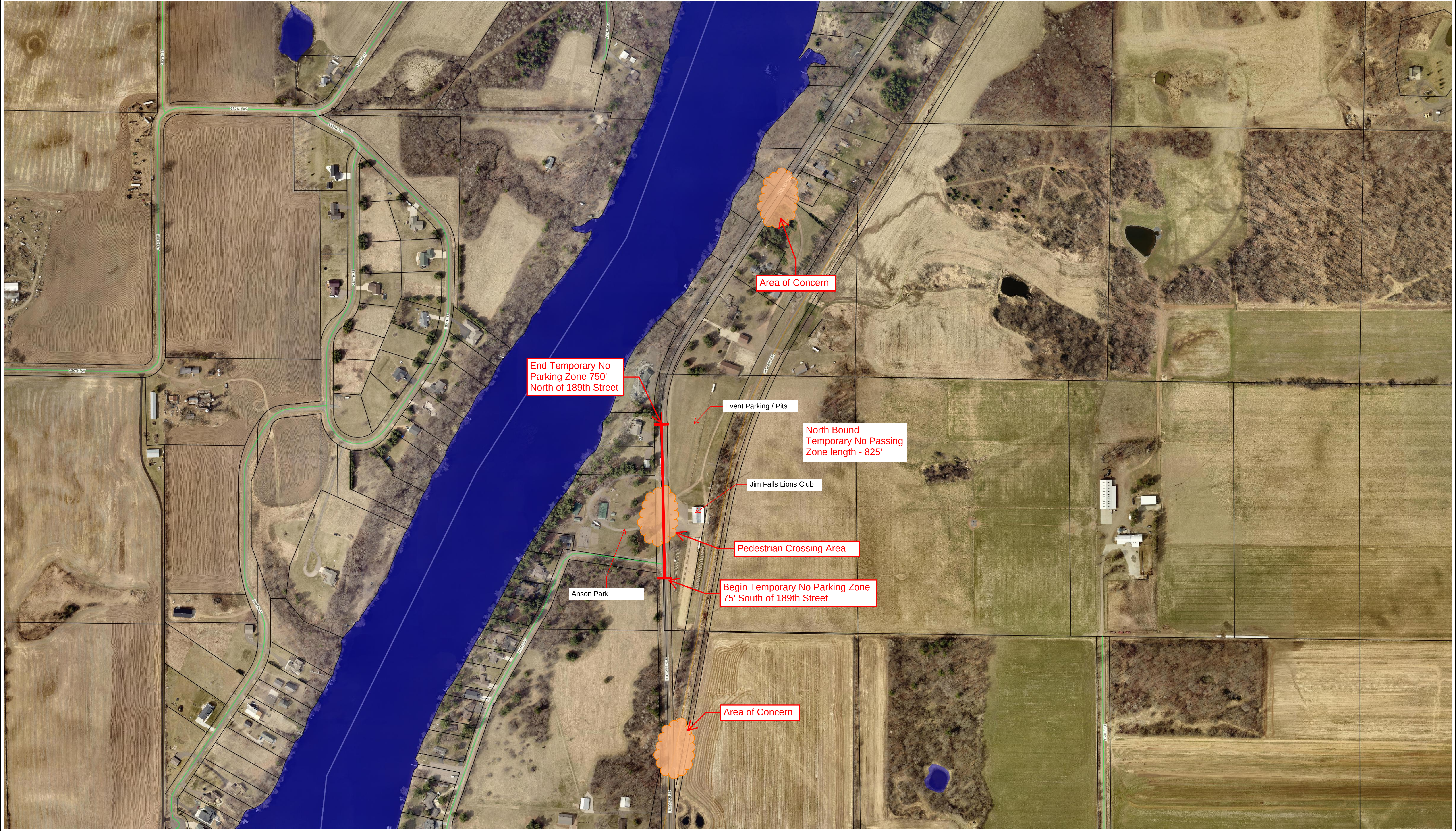

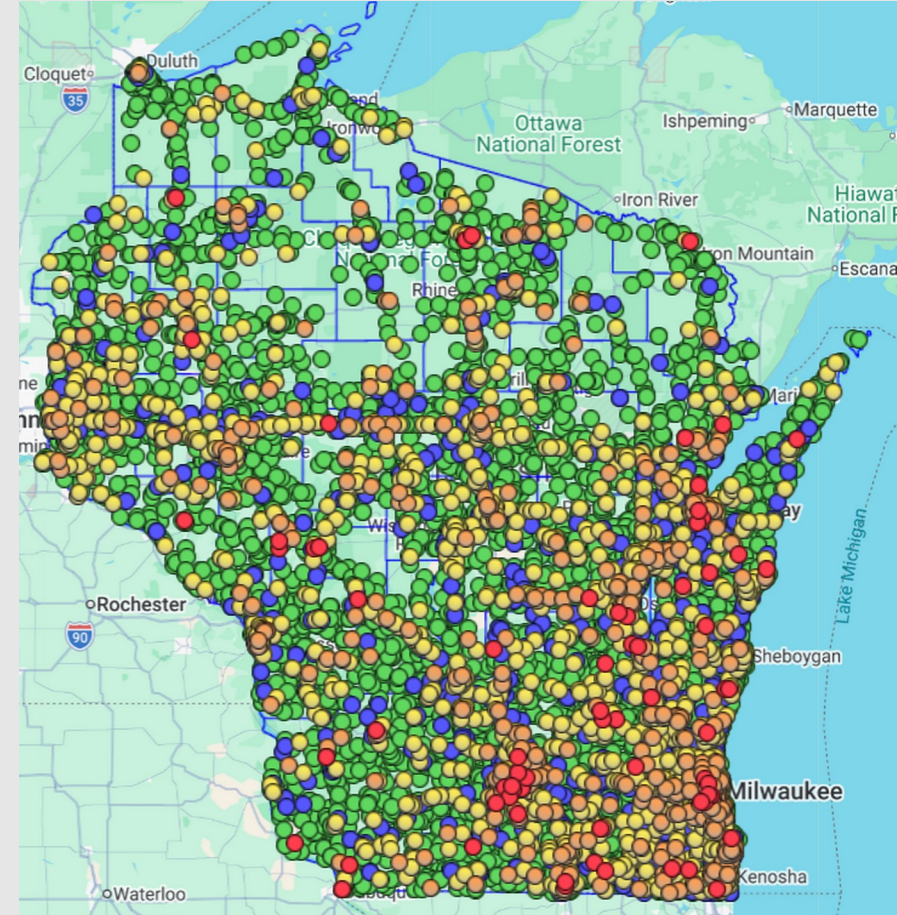

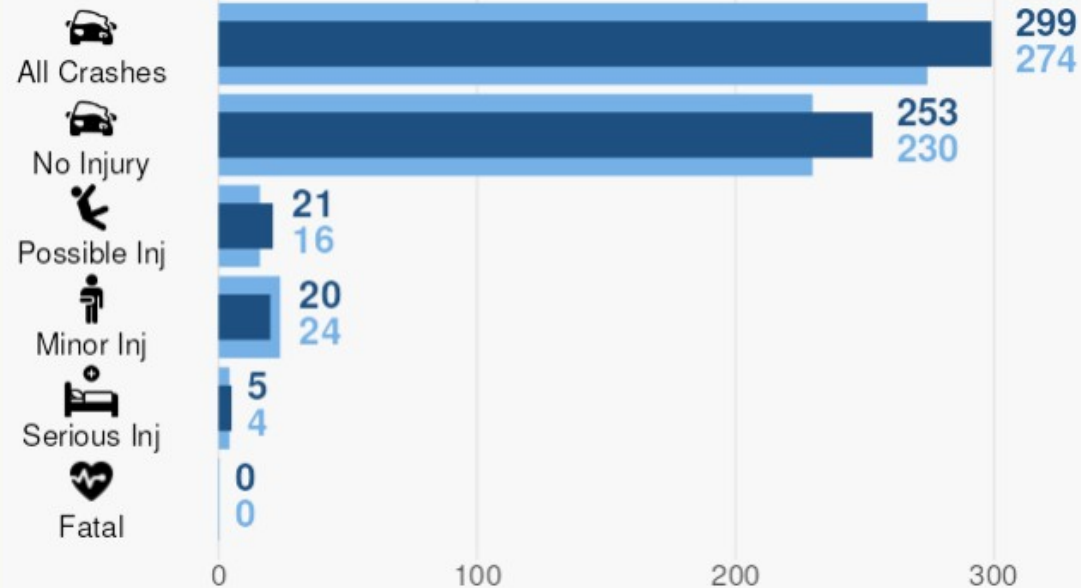

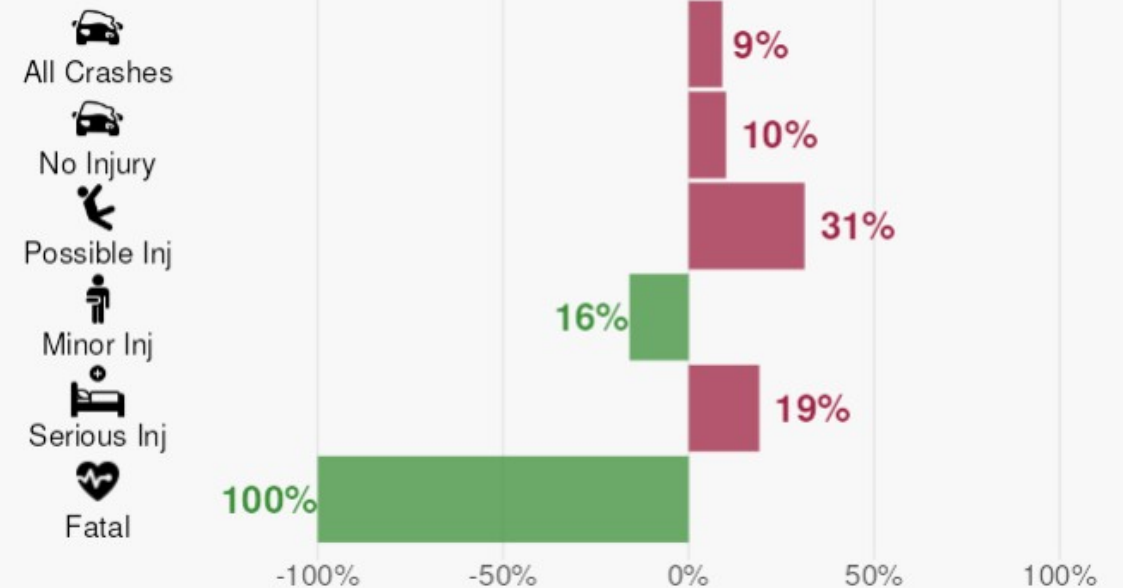


1Q 2026 County Crash Statistics

 Percent Change

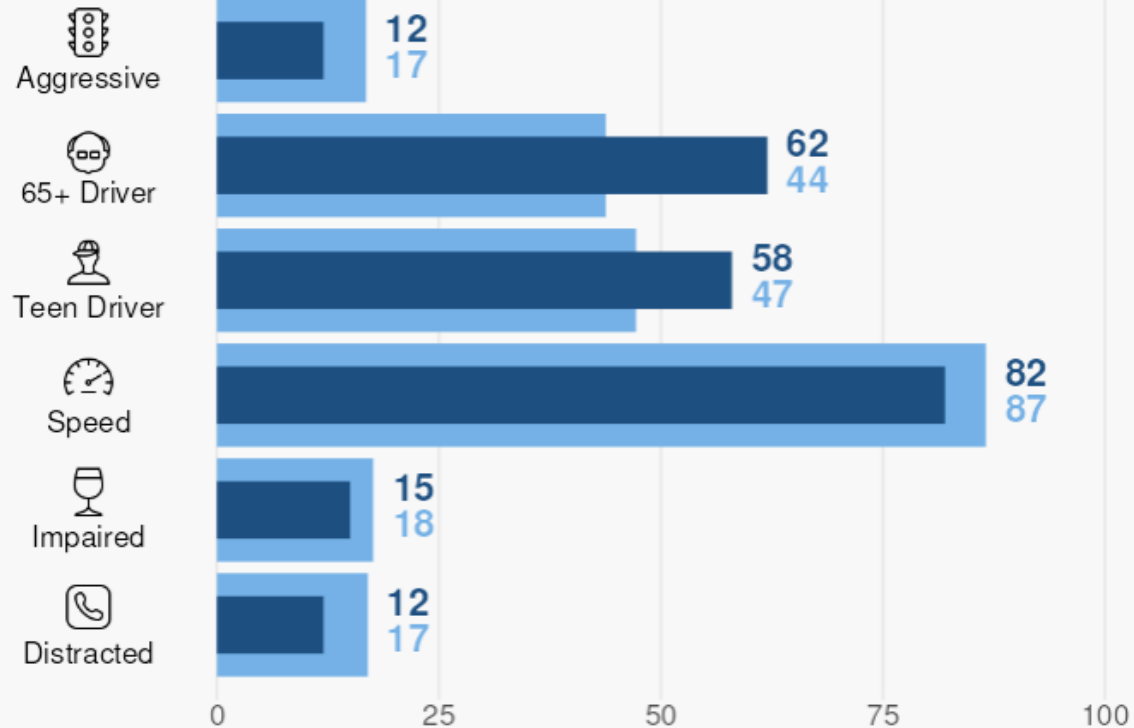


2026 vs. Average of Previous Five Years

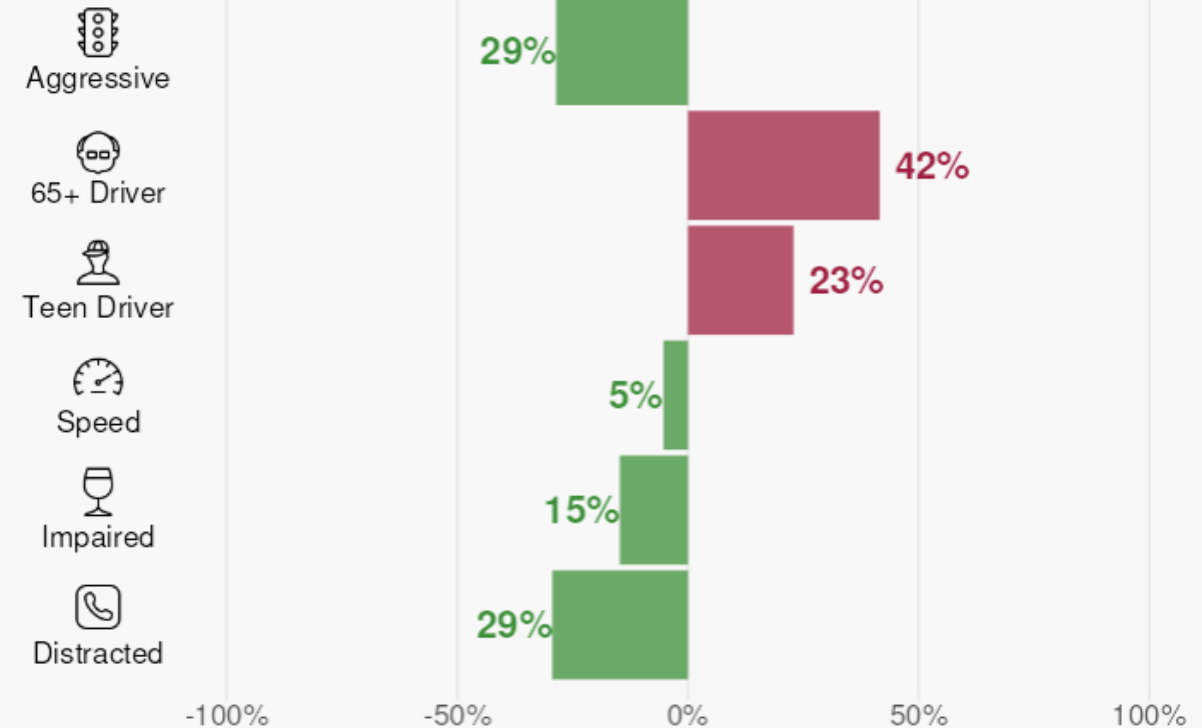

Driver Behavior



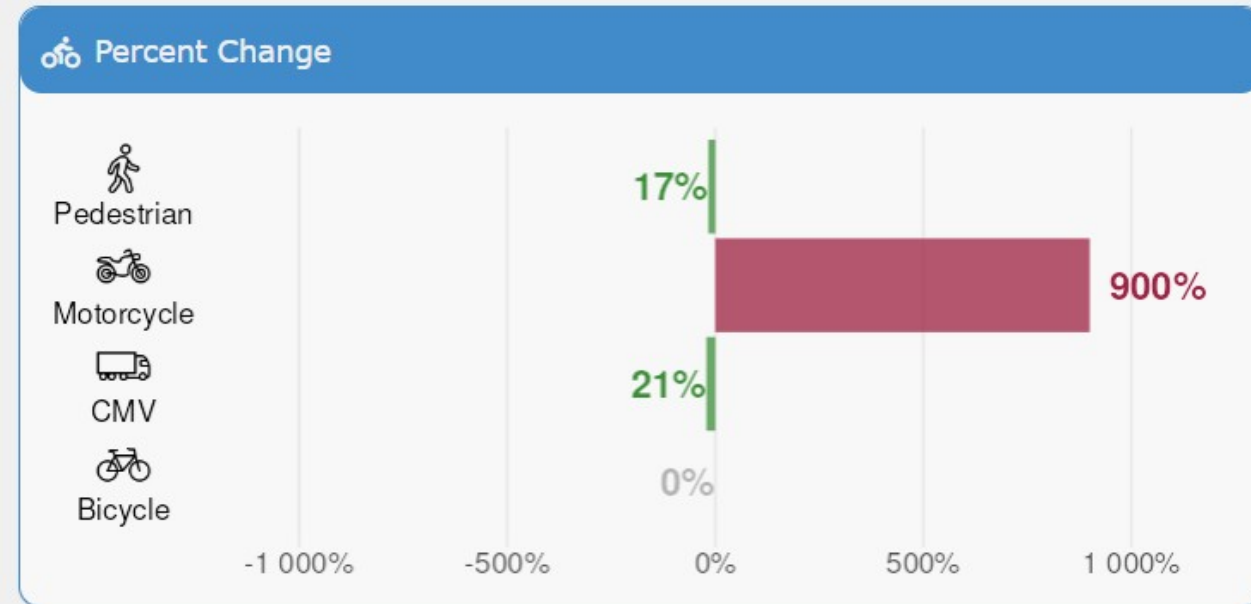
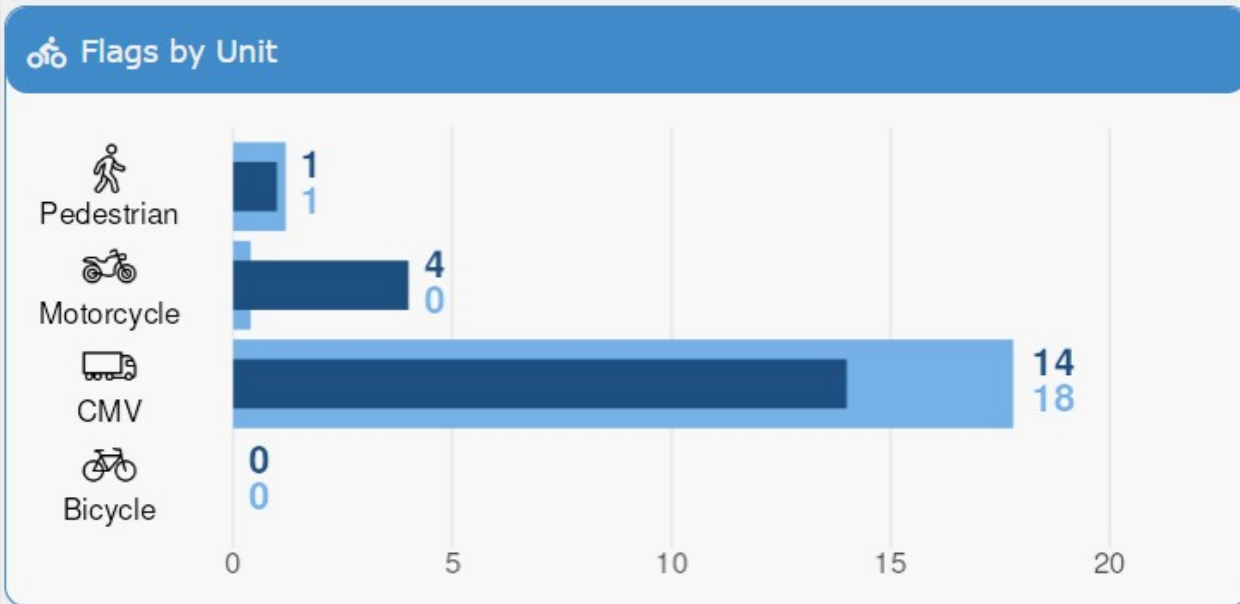

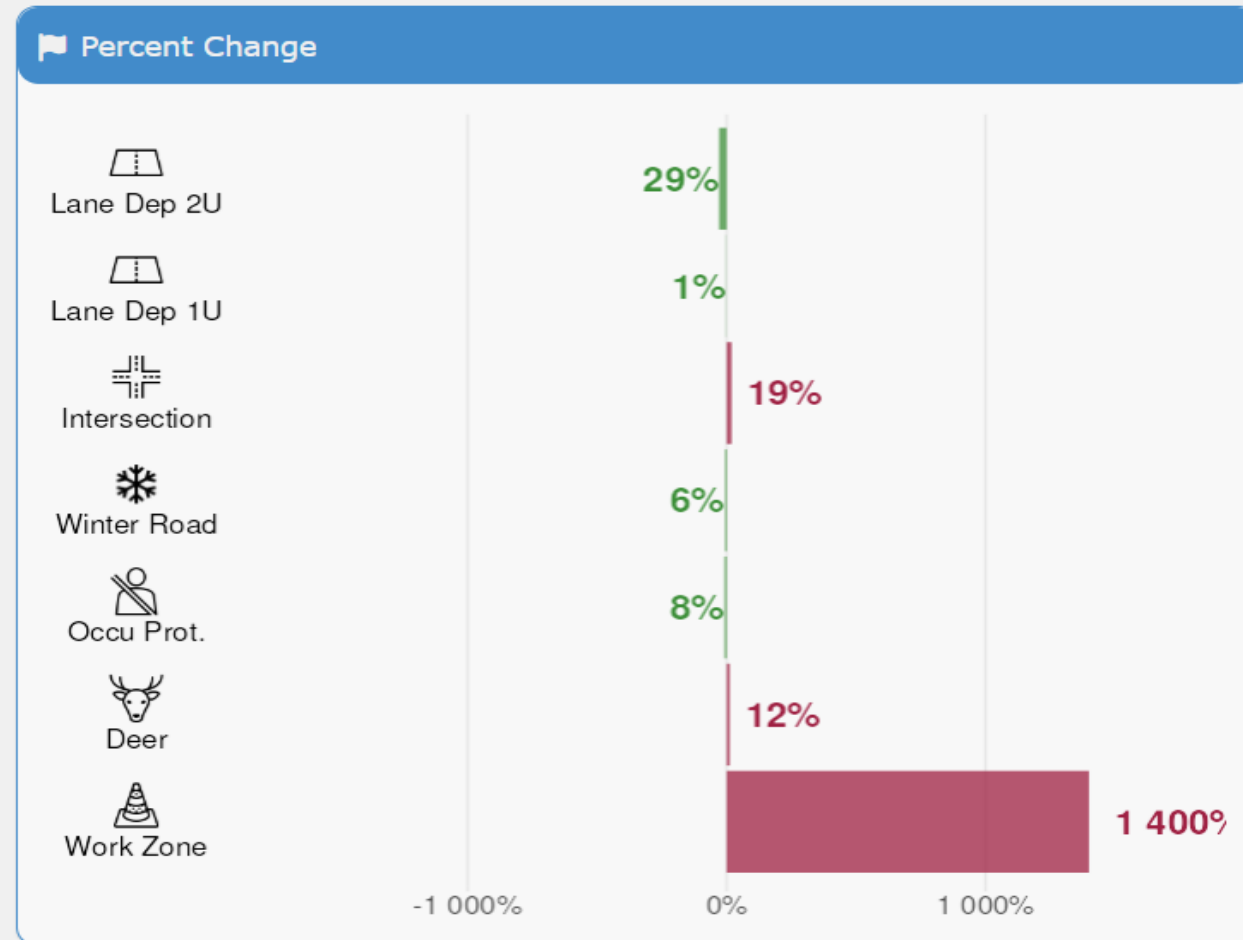

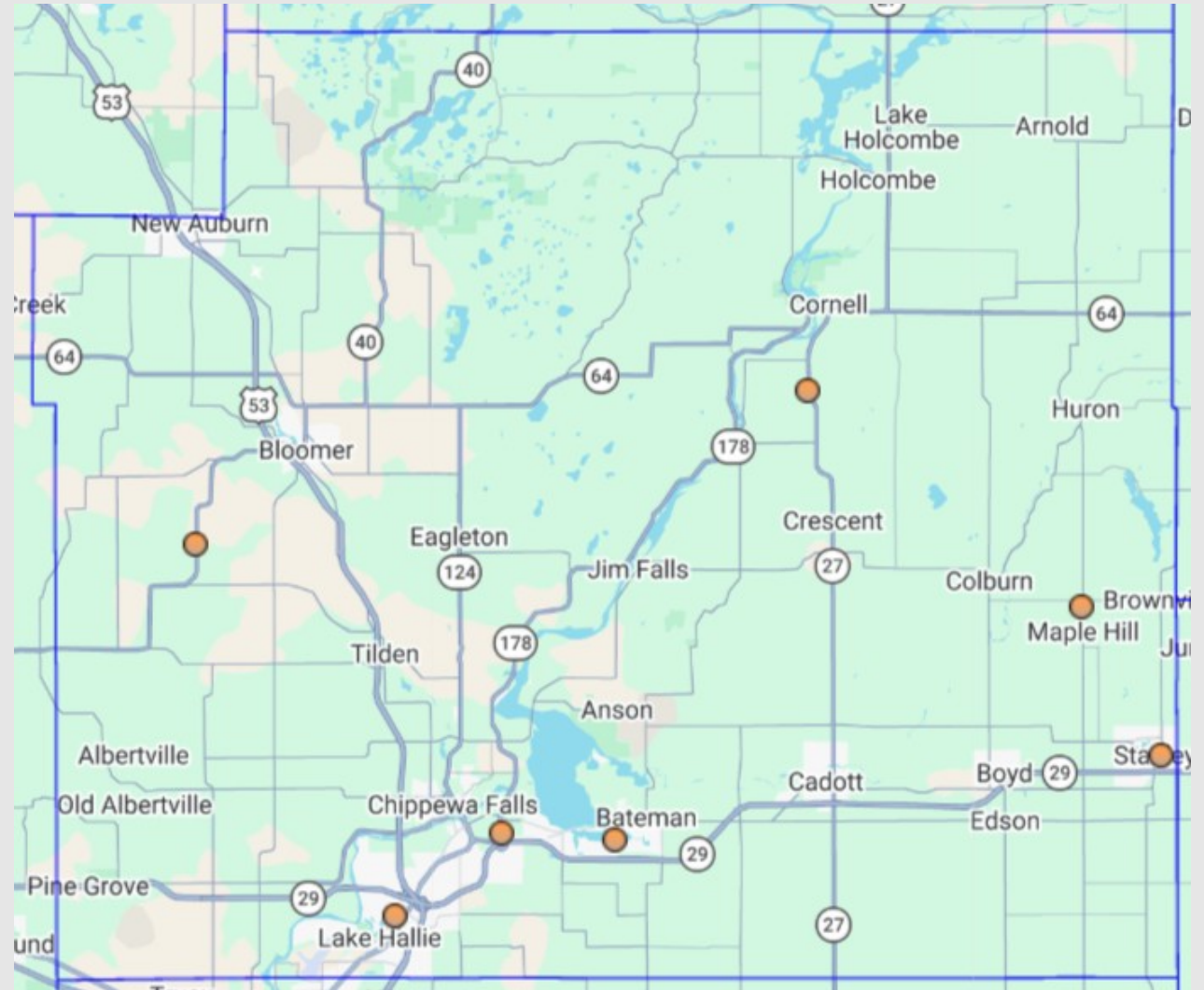

HSIP Basics: Overview

- Projects that reduce the number and severity of crashes on all public roads
- Focused on infrastructure improvements identified and selected through a **data-driven** approach
- A federal **reimbursement** program and not a federal grant program
 - 90% federal HSIP funds available for most projects
 - 10% match required - determined by jurisdictional system the roadway is on



Program Cycle & Application Deadlines

- Four-year program¹
- Solicitation is on a bi-annual cycle (Spring and Fall)
- Current program is SFY2027-2030
 - Fall Cycle: August 15th, 2026
 - Spring Cycle: February 15th, 2027

¹Projects with longer, more complicated delivery schedules (at least 4 years) will be considered for approval in Years 5 and 6; but will be given lower priority than projects that can be delivered quickly.



Typical Eligible Projects*

As allowed under statutes when applicable

- Intersection safety improvements
 - Roundabouts, Traffic Signals, All-Way Stops, Turn Lanes, Realignments
- Signal Visibility/Equipment improvements
 - Reflective backplates, Flashing Yellow Arrows, Signal heads per lane
- Installing signs, delineators, flashing warning lights
- Lane Departure improvements
 - Shoulder paving, rumble strips, high friction surface treatment
- Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvements
- Access Modifications
- Improving sight distance

High Risk Rural Roads Program (HRRRP)

- WisDOT screening and detailed crash review for County Trunk Highways
 - 25 corridors are selected for further review and analysis
- With local agency participation, a WisDOT consultant reviews each corridor and develops a Corridor Safety Evaluation (CSE)
- CSE includes:
 - Summary of locations in the corridor with safety concerns
 - List of safety treatment within the corridor eligible for HRRRP funding
 - Cost estimates for design and construction if eligible treatments
- CSE is no cost or commitment to local agencies
 - Does not require agency to take action under HSIP

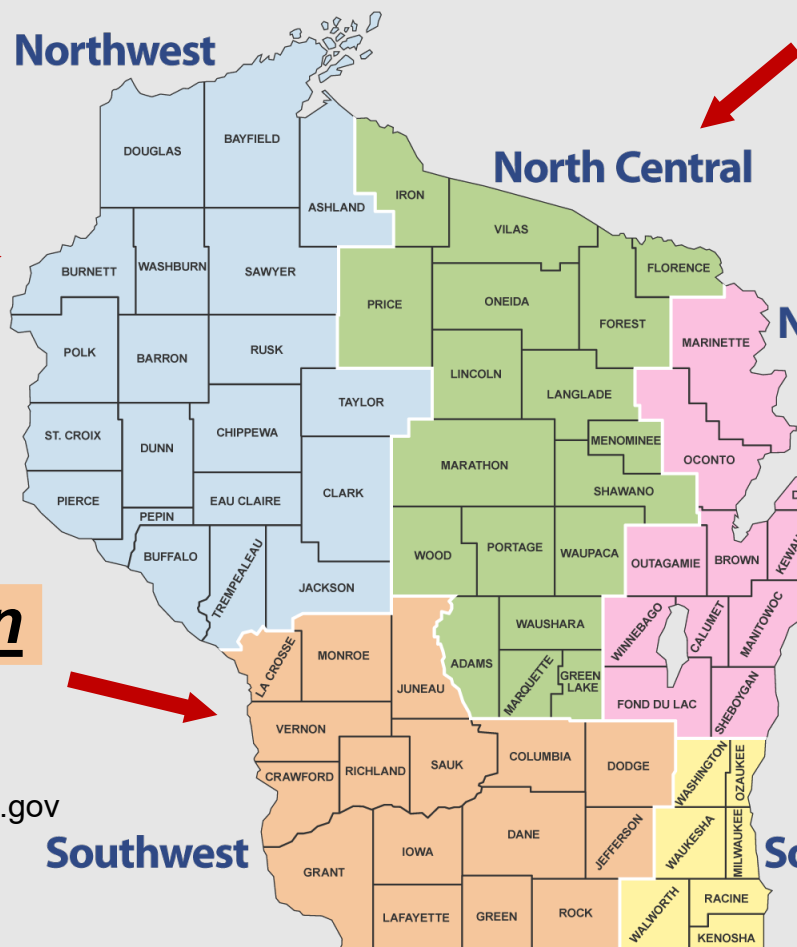

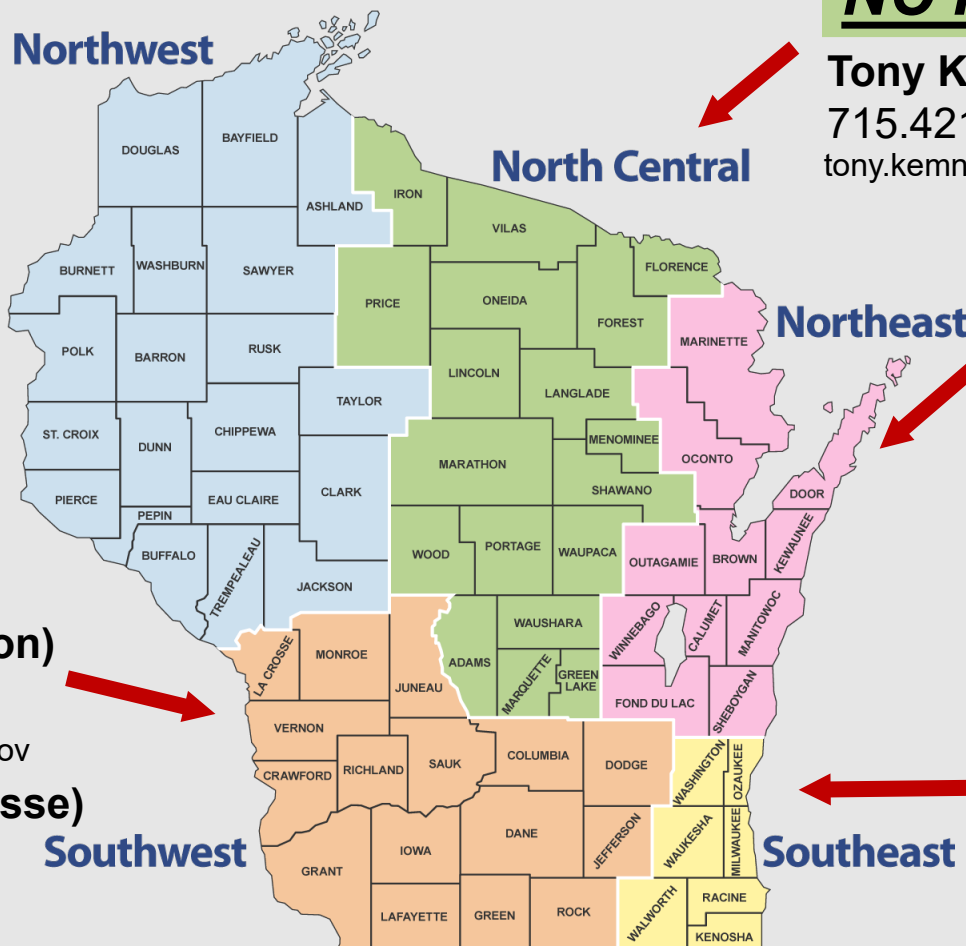

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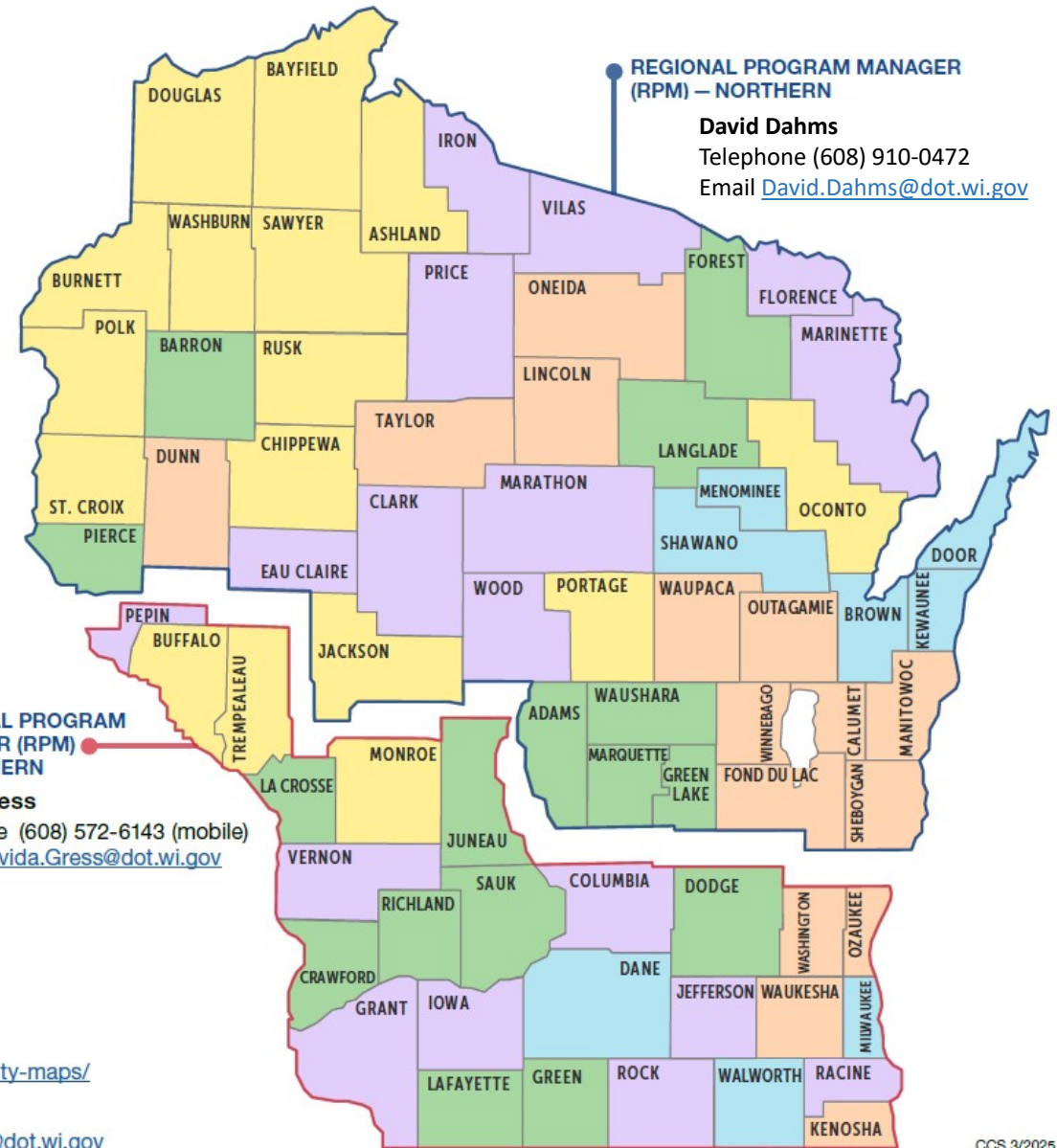
