3. Resolution to Authorize the Purchase of TruNarc Handheld Narcotics Analyzers for the Sheriff's Department with Opioid Litigation Settlement Funds – Randy Scholz/Curt Dutton
Dutton was not able to attend the meeting so the Sheriff explained this resolution.

Hakes explained this initiative was put in motion before he started here and Dutton did the research. The devices can detect Fentanyl. Mail coming in to the jail is a good example of this potential exposure. Using this device will help keep staff safe. Hakes is not sure how much calibration needs to be done with the unit.

Scholz explained this meets the requirements so we can use the Opioid settlement funds. The device uses a laser that goes through plastic so you don't have to open up the package. New software is downloaded as needed. This will not be hosted on our network. If approved, this will allow the Sheriff's Department to have one analyzer on each patrol shift and one in the jail.

Hakes explained the County has universal kits (Narcan) in the jail and evidence room and available in other locations as well when evidence comes in.

Scholz explained there is a reporting element when using the Opioid settlement funds. However, we

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don't know yet what exactly the report is but our understanding is that it is required once per year.

STATEMENT OF EXPLANATION

Resolution No.

RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE PARTICIPATION IN THE BROADBAND EQUITY, ACCESS AND DEPLOYMENT (BEAD) LOCAL PLANNING GRANT PROGRAM

1 Passage of this resolution will formally authorize Chippewa County to opt into the
 2 Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) Local Planning Grants program. The total
 3 grant funding is \$1.5 million dollars and is part of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act
 4 and will be allocated to Wisconsin counties and federally recognized Tribes that opt into the
 5 program. It is estimated that Chippewa County would receive between \$12,000 - \$16,000
 6 dollars to be used to generate locally informed analysis of broadband needs and develop each
 7 community's vision for broadband development. Local planning activities may include a needs
 8 assessment, outreach and stakeholder engagement, and a strategy for broadband deployment.
 9 County and Tribal planning activities will inform Wisconsin's Five-Year Broadband Action Plan
 10 and future grant funding for broadband infrastructure projects across the state.

11 The BEAD Local Planning Grants are not competitive grants, but rather based on formula
 12 funding to determine the allocation for each applicant that elects to participate in the program.
 13 Participation is not required, however if Chippewa County chooses not to participate, then the
 14 county may lose the opportunity to access future broadband funding. The grant funding will be
 15 distributed equally to all participating counties and Tribes, and entities choosing to collaborate
 16 in Regional Development Organizations (REDO's) will receive an additional 10 percent of the
 17 base allocation. Chippewa County's REDO is Momentum West. The County Administrator is
 18 recommending that Chippewa County opt in to the BEAD grant program collaboratively with
 19 Momentum West. The online BEAD Local Grant Program Participation Form must be submitted
 20 by March 7, 2023. The attached PSC letter regarding the BEAD program provides further
 21 details.

**RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE PARTICIPATION IN THE BROADBAND EQUITY, ACCESS AND
DEPLOYMENT (BEAD) LOCAL PLANNING GRANT PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, the Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) Program provides \$42.45 billion to expand high-speed internet access by funding planning, infrastructure deployment and adoption programs in all 50 states, Washington D.C., Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, Guam, American Samoa, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands; and

WHEREAS, on February 1, 2023, the Wisconsin Public Service Commission (PSC) approved allocation of this formula funding to Wisconsin counties and federally recognized Tribes in the amount of \$1.5 million for those counties and Tribes that opt into the program; and

WHEREAS, the purposes of the BEAD grant funding is to generate locally informed analysis of broadband needs and develop Chippewa County's vision for broadband development; and

WHEREAS, to fulfill the purpose of the BEAD grant funding, Chippewa County may need to complete a needs assessment, do outreach and stakeholder engagement, and develop a strategy for broadband deployment; and

WHEREAS, these BEAD grant funded local planning activities will be completed statewide to inform Wisconsin's Five-Year Broadband Action Plan, including future grant funding for broadband infrastructure projects across the State; and

WHEREAS, the BEAD grant funding will be distributed equally to all participating counties and Tribes, and entities choosing to collaborate in Regional Development Organizations (REDO's) will receive an additional 10 percent of the base allocation; and

WHEREAS, Chippewa County's REDO is Momentum West and it is the County Administrator's recommendation that Chippewa County opt in to the BEAD grant program collaboratively with Momentum West as Chippewa County does not have the resources to complete these broadband planning activities; and

WHEREAS, to be eligible for the BEAD Local Planning Grant funding, Chippewa County must submit a BEAD Local Planning Grant Program Participation Form to the Broadband Office of the PSC by March 7, 2023;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Chippewa County hereby authorizes participation in the Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) Local Planning Grants

program and commits to complying with all related grant requirements; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Administrator is authorized to be the primary point of contact regarding the BEAD Local Planning Program and is authorized to complete and file the BEAD Local Planning Grant Program Participation Form with the Broadband Office of the Public Service Commission; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Administrator provide periodic updates to the County Board regarding the BEAD Grant program, how the County is intending to use the BEAD grant funding, how the funding is being applied, and any strategy that is developed for broadband deployment in Chippewa County as part of the BEAD grant funding program.

Forwarded to the County Board by the Executive Committee.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact to Chippewa County by passage of this resolution, however passage will lead to grant funds being awarded to the County.

RE: Wisconsin Broadband, Equity, Access and Deployment (BEAD) Local Planning Grant Program

On Wednesday, February 8, 2023, we received a letter from the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSC) regarding upcoming funds for broadband initiatives. This is the first information we received about these funds and unfortunately there is a short turn-around for the County to respond.

The BEAD funds will be available to all counties and federally recognized Tribes. The BEAD Local Planning Grants are not competitive grants. They use formula funding to determine the allocation for each applicant that elects to participate in the program. Participation is not required. However, if we chose not to participate then we may lose the opportunity to access funding. Funding will be distributed equally to all participating counties and Tribes, and those collaborating in groups will receive an additional 10 percent of the base allocation.

If we want to participate then we **need to submit the letter of intent by March 7, 2023.**

If the County wishes to participate, the only way we will meet this timeline is to have an Executive Committee meeting on February 21st, prior to the special County Board meeting. This will allow us the ability to bring forward a resolution for approval.

Attached is a copy of the letter we received along with a map of Wisconsin Regional Economic Development Partners.

At this time the details of this program are not fully known, which is frustrating, as they are forcing us to meet an aggressive timeline, or possibly miss out on an opportunity for funding in Chippewa County. The PSC will be releasing more information and the online application form. The Wisconsin Broadband Office will then inform those participating when the formula has been processed and the application is open, likely by March 13, 2023.

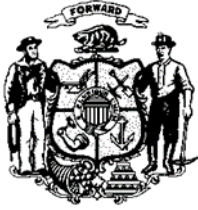

Dear County Executives, Administrators, and Administrative Coordinators:

The Public Service Commission of Wisconsin is committed to making high-speed internet accessible and affordable for all Wisconsinites. Throughout 2023, the Commission's Broadband Office will be engaging with a wide range of stakeholders to develop a Five-Year Action Plan for broadband and State Digital Equity Plan under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act's Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) and Digital Equity programs. These statewide plans will serve as Wisconsin's roadmap to the implementation of high-speed internet for all.

It is a federal requirement that 5-year action plans must be informed by collaboration with local and regional entities. Local governments will be key partners in the planning process. Successful broadband deployment requires inclusive and comprehensive engagement, and local leaders have knowledge, passion, and vision that are essential to Wisconsin's planning. The Commission is committed to supporting local planning and [recently approved](#) \$1.5 million in formula funding to Wisconsin counties and federally recognized Tribes under the BEAD Local Planning Grant Program in docket [5-BP-2023](#). These resources are being made available to support efforts to define the need, vision, and strategy for deployment of broadband in your communities. In addition to formula grants, the Commission is working collaboratively with the University of Wisconsin-Extension and the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation to provide technical assistance and coordination which could support your planning efforts.

To be eligible for this funding, Counties have the opportunity to opt into the BEAD Local Planning Grant Program by submitting the attached letter of intent by March 7, 2023 at 1:30 p.m. Counties may elect to participate individually, or work collaboratively through a [Regional Economic Development Organization \(REDO\)](#) and receive a 10 percent increase to the county allocation. A county planning to partner with a REDO may choose to engage with the local organization early to ensure coordination throughout the application process.

Following March 7th, the Commission will contact counties and relevant REDO partners that opt into the program with further guidance on receipt of funding. In the coming weeks, the Commission's Broadband office plans to make available additional information regarding BEAD Local Planning Grants, including details on program requirements, planning activities, project timelines, and eligible expenditures. Section I: Overview

Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) Local Planning Grants are available in the form of formula funding of \$1.5 million under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act to Wisconsin counties and federally recognized Tribes to generate locally informed analysis of broadband needs and develop each community's vision for broadband development. The Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (Commission) approved the allocation of this formula funding in docket 5-BP-2023 on February 1, 2023. Local planning activities may include a needs assessment, outreach and stakeholder engagement, and a strategy for broadband deployment. County and Tribal planning activities will inform Wisconsin's Five-Year Broadband Action Plan and future grant funding for broadband infrastructure projects across the state.

BEAD Local Planning Grants are not competitive grants but rather formula funding that will be allocated to each applicant that elects to participate in the program. Counties that elect to participate in the program may opt to (1) collaborate regionally through their respective [Regional Development organization \(REDO\)](#) or (2) participate independently. Tribes that elect to participate may opt to (1) collaborate regionally with a REDO, (2) collaborate with the Great Lakes Inter-Tribal Council, or (3) participate independently.

Funding will be distributed equally to all participating counties and Tribes, with those collaborating in groups receiving an additional 10 percent of the base allocation. Participation is not required, and the total grant allocation amount for each participating entity will be formulated following the submission deadline of this participation form. If a REDO or the Great Lakes Inter-Tribal Council coordinates on behalf of multiple counties or Tribes, it will receive and administer funding directly.

By completing this form, counties and Tribes are certifying their intent to participate in the program, including complying with related grant requirements. A subsequent grant agreement will delineate eligible costs for use of funding, applicable federal grant compliance requirements, and project deliverables. Each entity that opts in will be responsible to ensure compliance with applicable federal and state requirements related to this funding.

Following the Commission's Wisconsin Broadband Office's announcement of formula grant awards, those counties and Tribes that elected to participate individually and participating collaboratives will complete a brief application in the Commission's Online Grants System that describes planned activities and the intended use of funding among cost categories. Further details on completing the online application will be made available in forthcoming grant instructions available on the Commission website. The Wisconsin Broadband Office will inform participating REDOs, Tribes, and individual counties when the formula allocation has been processed and that the application is open in the online grants system, likely by March 13, 2023.

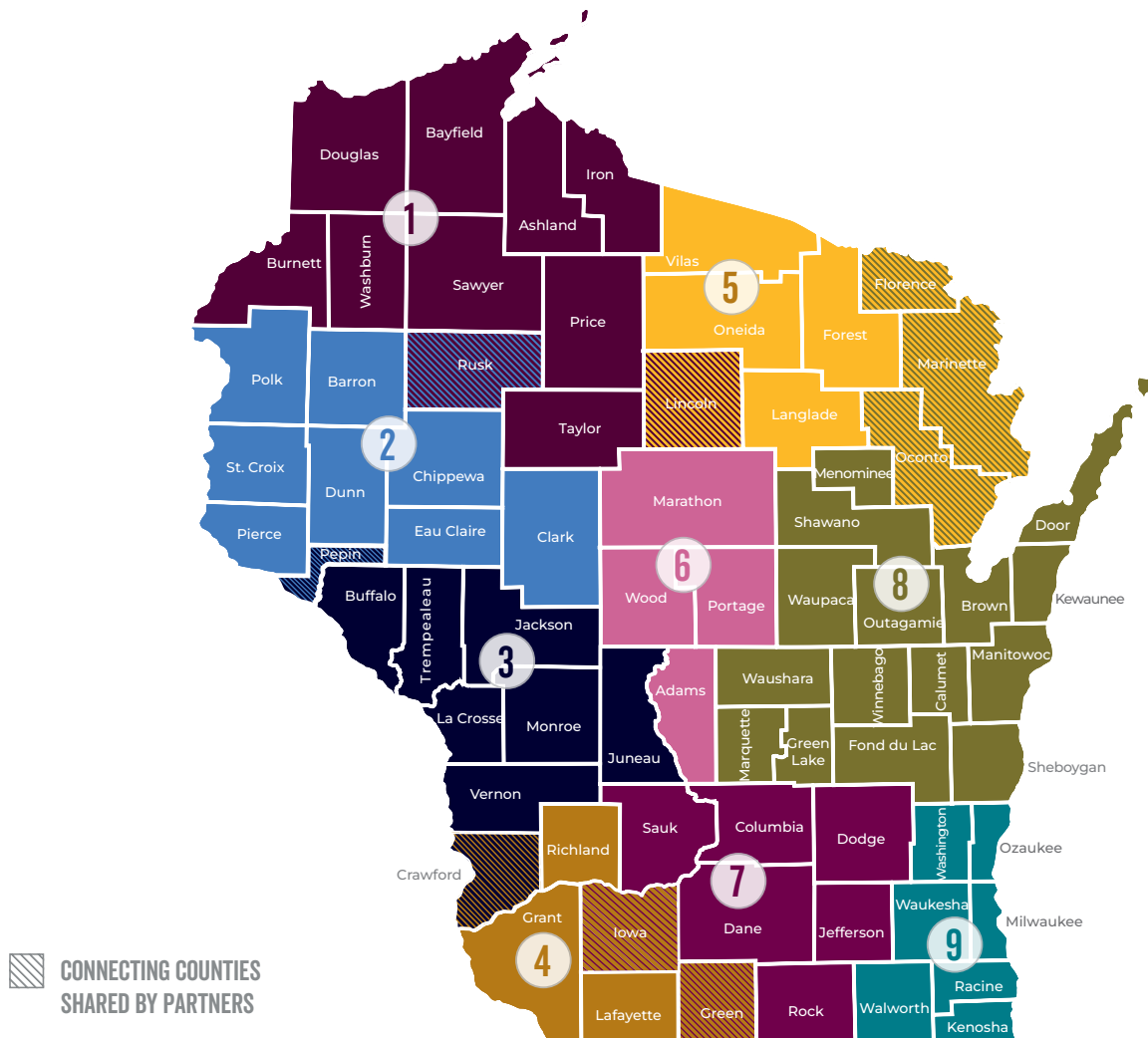
