RESOLUTION TO DISALLOW CLAIM OF MATTHEW KOXLIN

Matthew Koxlien filed a formal Notice of Claim against the County pursuant to Wisconsin Statutes § 893.80. Mr. Koxlien is claiming property damage to his 2023 Toyota Camry. Mr. Koxlien claims that the windshield of his Toyota Camry was damaged when stones were kicked up by a County Highway Department vehicle traveling westbound on State Highway 29. The incident occurred on May 6, 2025, and the claim was received by the Chippewa County Clerk's Office on June 6, 2025. The damage amount claimed is \$854.55, per the estimate from Auto Vision Center provided by Mr. Koxlien.

Upon review of the claim by the County's liability insurance company, Wisconsin Municipal Mutual Insurance Company (WMMIC), it is WMMIC's recommendation that the County formally disallow the claim. Passage of this resolution will formally disallow this claim pursuant to Section 2-60(l)(3) of the Chippewa County Code of Ordinances, which provides that the Executive Committee has the authority to settle claims that do not exceed \$10,000.

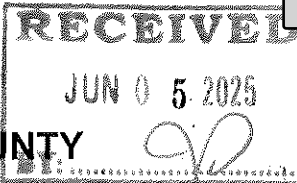

RESOLUTION DELEGATING THE AUTHORITY TO ENTER INTO SETTLEMENT AGREEMENTS WITH OPIOID DEFENDANTS TO THE CHIPPEWA COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR

1 The Chippewa County Board of Supervisors previously authorized the County to enter
2 into an engagement agreement with von Briesen & Roper, s.c., Crueger Dickinson LLC and
3 Simmons Hanly Conroy LLP (the “Law Firms”) to pursue litigation against certain manufacturers,
4 distributors, and retailers of opioid pharmaceuticals (the “Opioid Defendants”) in an effort to
5 hold the Opioid Defendants financially responsible for the County’s vast expenditure of money
6 and resources to combat the opioid epidemic. The Law Firms filed lawsuits on behalf of
7 Chippewa County and 66 other Wisconsin counties and all Wisconsin cases were coordinated
8 with thousands of other lawsuits filed against the same or substantially similar parties as the
9 Opioid Defendants in the Northern District of Ohio, captioned *In re: Opioid Litigation*, MDL 2804
10 (the “Litigation”). Since the inception of the Litigation, the Law Firms have coordinated with
11 counsel from around the country to prepare the County’s case for trial and engage in extensive
12 settlement discussions with the Opioid Defendants.

14 The Plaintiffs’ Executive Committee (“PEC”), which is comprised of attorneys
15 representative of all litigating local governments around the country, including the Law Firms,
16 reviews proposed settlement terms with Opioid Defendants for recommendation of individual
17 approval by the litigating local governments, including Chippewa County. The representatives
18 of the Law Firms who serve on the PEC are intimately familiar with the terms of previous
19 settlements and will be familiar with the terms of any settlement with any other Opioid
20 Defendant recommended by the PEC. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 165.12, the Legislature’s Joint
21 Committee on Finance is also required to approve settlement agreements between the County
22 and Opioid Defendants. It is anticipated that several additional settlements will be proposed by
23 various Opioid Defendants and recommended for approval by the PEC.

25 Chippewa County’s process for approving settlement with an Opioid Defendant is
26 typically a process requiring weeks for committee review and approval as well as approval by
27 the full Chippewa County Board of Supervisors. Given concerns surrounding timing for

28 participation in future settlements combined with the number of anticipated settlements, it
29 would be prudent for Chippewa County to create a process whereby the authority to enter into

33 Passage of this Resolution will delegate to the County Administrator the authority to

**RESOLUTION DELEGATING THE AUTHORITY TO ENTER INTO SETTLEMENT AGREEMENTS WITH

WHEREAS, the Chippewa County Board of Supervisors previously authorized the County to enter into an engagement agreement with von Briesen & Roper, s.c., Crueger Dickinson LLC and Simmons Hanly Conroy LLP (the “Law Firms”) to pursue litigation against certain manufacturers, distributors, and retailers of opioid pharmaceuticals (the “Opioid Defendants”) in an effort to hold the Opioid Defendants financially responsible for the County’s vast expenditure of money and resources to combat the opioid epidemic; and

WHEREAS, on behalf of the County, the Law Firms filed a lawsuit against the Opioid Defendants; and

WHEREAS, the Law Firms filed similar lawsuits on behalf of 66 other Wisconsin counties and all Wisconsin cases were coordinated with thousands of other lawsuits filed against the same or substantially similar parties as the Opioid Defendants in the Northern District of Ohio, captioned *In re: Opioid Litigation*, MDL 2804 (the “Litigation”); and

WHEREAS, four (4) additional Wisconsin counties (Milwaukee, Dane, Waukesha, and Walworth) hired separate counsel and joined the Litigation; and

WHEREAS, since the inception of the Litigation, the Law Firms have coordinated with counsel from around the country (including counsel for Milwaukee, Dane, Waukesha, and Walworth Counties) to prepare the County’s case for trial and engage in extensive settlement discussions with the Opioid Defendants; and

WHEREAS, 2021 Wisconsin Act 57 created Section 165.12 of the Wisconsin Statutes relating to the settlement of all or part of the Litigation; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 165.12(2), the Legislature’s Joint Committee on Finance is required to approve settlement agreements between the County and Opioid Defendants; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 165.12(2), the proceeds from any settlement of all or part of the Litigation are distributed 70% to local governments in Wisconsin that are parties to the Litigation and 30% to the State; and

WHEREAS, Wis. Stat. § 165.12(7) bars claims from any Wisconsin local government against the Opioid Defendants filed after June 1, 2021; and

WHEREAS, several of the Opioid Defendants previously agreed to settlement terms with

85 the Plaintiffs' Executive Committee ("PEC"), which is comprised of attorneys representative of
86 all litigating local governments around the country, subject to individual approval of the
87 litigating local governments including Chippewa County; and

89 WHEREAS, representatives of the Law Firms serve on the PEC and, therefore, are
90 intimately familiar with the terms of the previous settlements and will be familiar with the
91 terms of any settlement with any other Opioid Defendant recommended for approval by the

94 WHEREAS, it is anticipated that several additional settlements will be proposed by

107 WHEREAS, the intent of this Resolution is to delegate to the County Administrator the
108 authority to enter into settlement agreements with any Opioid Defendant from the date of this
109 Resolution forward provided (a) the settlement is recommended for approval by the PEC and
110 the Law Firms; and (b) the Chippewa County share of proceeds from any such settlement is
111 consistent with the shares established in Exhibit A to Addendum 2, a copy of which is attached

115 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Chippewa County Board of Supervisors

- 128 2. Prior to executing any settlement agreement, or any document related thereto,

the County Administrator shall provide notice to the County Board Chair and the Executive Committee of the proposed settlement and the terms related thereto.

3. The County Administrator is authorized and directed to take any and all such other and further action necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all proceeds from any settlement agreement not otherwise directed to the Attorney Fees Account shall be deposited in the County's Opioid Abatement Account. The Opioid Abatement Account shall be administered consistent with the terms of this Resolution, Wis. Stat. § 165.12(4), and the applicable settlement agreement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chippewa County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the establishment of an account separate and distinct from any account containing funds allocated or allocable to the County which shall be referred to by the County as the "Attorney Fees Account." An escrow agent shall deposit a sum equal to, up to, but in no event exceeding, an amount equal to 20% of the County's proceeds from a settlement agreement into the Attorney Fees Account unless such other amount is established by the applicable settlement agreement. If the payments to the County are not enough to fully fund the Attorney Fees Account as provided herein because such payments are made over time, the Attorney Fees Account shall be funded by placing up to, but in no event exceeding, an amount equal to 20% of the proceeds from a settlement agreement attributable to Local Governments (as that term is defined in the MOU) into the Attorney Fees Account for each payment. Funds in the Attorney Fees Account shall be utilized to pay the fees, costs, and disbursements owed to the Law Firms pursuant to the engagement agreement between the County and the Law Firms provided, however, the Law Firms shall receive no more than that to which they are entitled under their fee contract when considering the amounts paid the Law Firms from any fee fund established in a settlement agreement and allocable to the County. The Law Firms may make application for payment from the Attorney Fees Account at any time and the County shall cooperate with the Law Firms in executing any documents necessary for the escrow agent to make payments out of the Attorney Fees Account; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all actions heretofore taken by the Chippewa County Board of Supervisors and other appropriate public officers and agents of the County with respect to the matters contemplated under this Resolution are hereby ratified, confirmed and approved.
